

#### Bishopric Message—Jeff Child

Christmas is almost here! It's the time to celebrate the humble birth of the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Prince of Peace. It also seems to be the busiest and most stressful time of the year. Braving the stores (or the internet) to find the perfect gifts for each of your loved ones, putting together the menu for the best Christmas party, and decorating the home with the latest in Christmas decor trends seem to be what the world thinks of Christmas. Is this what we experience at Christmas?

I often find myself drawn to the story of Mary and Joseph, the birth of the baby in a stable and gently placed in a manger. In my mind's eye I think of that experience as one of peace and quiet, perfectly staged like the nativity on the mantel.



Then I think back to the day of the birth of my first child, Ava. I remember Kari having strong contractions the night before her birth. I don't remember feeling peace that night.

The next day, I remember taking one last trip to the store where Kari would stop every few minutes to brace for another contraction. I don't remember feeling peace in ShopKo.

I remember the doctors performing a cesarean section, the doctors struggling to deliver Ava's head, where the mood of the operating room went from casual chatter to serious silence. I don't remember feeling peace during her delivery.

And finally, I remember them taking Ava to the table where they checked her vital signs, cleaned her, and I heard her cry for the very first time. They brought her and placed her with Kari, and I finally remember feeling peace.

This must have been similar to how Mary and Joseph felt. I doubt they felt peace as they traveled that great distance to Bethlehem, or as they entered the bustling city with all the visitors coming to be counted, or as they struggled to find a clean place to stay for the night. But, as soon as the sweet baby Jesus was born, my guess is that the stress melted away into peace—the peace that comes from witnessing the plan of both salvation and happiness in action. The peace that can only come through Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace.

If you find yourself this Christmas season feeling overwhelmed, worried, or stressed, remember that peace can be found. It doesn't come from the presents, the food, or the decor. It comes, rather, from and through Jesus Christ, through focusing on Him and on His atonement. I have experienced His peace. I believe Alma when he said in Alma 38:8, "And it came to pass that I was three days and three nights in the most bitter pain and anguish of soul; and never, until I did cry out unto the Lord Jesus Christ for mercy, did I receive a remission of my sins. But behold, I did cry unto Him **and I did find peace to my soul**."




#### Primary


